1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Spain

Official language: Spanish
Population: 44. 108.530 inhabitants; density: 87.4 persons per square kilometre
Area: 504.782 square kilometres
Capital: Madrid
Type of government: parliamentary monarchy
Major religion: Catholicism
Life expectancy: Women- 83.1; men -75.7

Currency: The Spanish currency is the Euro which is made up of 100 cents. There are coins of 1,2,5,10,20 and 50 cents. Bank notes are of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500. You can change your money at any bank and at the hotel reception desks. However, in the hotels the rate of exchange is less favourable. International credit cards are accepted in hotels, shops and restaurants.

1.2 Monzon

Geography: The city of Monzón is located in the north of Spain and it is the second biggest city of Huesca, one of the provinces of Aragon Community. Monzon holds a population of about 15.500 citizens.

Climate: The climate in Monzon is cold in winter due the proximity to the mountains and moderate in summer.

Water: Tap water is completely safe for drinking.

Electricity: The electric current for use in homes and hotels is 220 volts (50 Hz) and the plugs used are two round pins

Telephone: Public telephones are installed all over Monzón, most will allow calls. There are some telephone booths which accept coins and others which operate with telephone cards. It is possible to buy telephone cards in some shops and hotels. Some telephones will also accept international credit cards.

Opening Hours: The shops in Monzon open between 9:00 and 10:00; they close for lunch at 13:00 or 14:00, and open in the afternoon at 16:30 or 17:00 until 20:00 or 21:00.

Banks and Savings Banks: Most of the banks open at 8:00 or 8:30 and close at 14:00 or 14:30. However, there is an extensive network of cash dispensers where you can draw out cash if you need.

3. ARRIVALS

3.1 Arrival by Air

Barcelona International Airport is the official airport.

3.1.1 Welcome Service

Upon arrival, teams will be met by LOC staff.

Once luggage has been collected, team members will be escorted to buses which will take them to their hotels.

Bus transport will operate for teams. Buses will be allocated to teams according to their arrival times and will be clearly identified by signage. These buses will be parked in a reserved area in the airport parking.

3.1.2 Transportation of Equipment

Teams will take their poles from the airport to hotel in the buses. The transfer time from the airport to the official hotels is 2h30m by bus (210km)

After the competition athletes should pick up their poles from the stadium to the hotel and take them to airport by the respective buses.

3.2 Visa Requirements

The member countries of the Schengen Agreement may not be required to show their passport on arrival. Otherwise, a valid passport or identity card is necessary for entry to Spain.

The following countries require visas to enter Spain: Turkey (TUR) and Serbia Montenegro (SCG)

5.4 Costs and EAA Quota

According to EAA Regulation 707.8 accommodation and full board for the visiting teams will be paid for by EAA for 4 days and for the following persons:

Teams: 4 athletes & 2 officials from each participating men's and women's team
Individuals: For 1 or 2 competitor(s) either in Decathlon or in Heptathlon only 1 official may be considered for the purpose of this regulation.

The following rates must be paid for "out of quota" team members and for additional days:

100 CHF (65,03 €) per person / per day for athletes/officials in a double room
130 CHF (85,54 €) per person / per day for athletes/officials in a single room

The team leader must settle any extra charges (bar, laundry, telephone etc) at the hotel reception desk, before departure.

For lunch and dinner, mineral water are available free of charge. All other drinks must be paid for.

A late serving provision will be made for those athletes detained at the stadium due to doping controls or protests.

5.6 Meeting Rooms for Teams

Arrangements can be made for team meeting rooms through the information desk in the hotel village. Requests shall be made at reasonable time in advance.

5.7 Medical Services in the Hotel

Medical assistance will be available 24 hours by phone. Team Leaders will receive the phone number upon arrival.

5.8 Telephone Calls

The telephone will be automatically activated to make room-to-room calls. Any athletes or delegation officials requiring the use of the room phone for outgoing calls must make arrangements with the information desk at the hotel. The telephone will be made available upon the presentation of a credit card to cover all charges.

All delegations will receive a telephone contact list of important telephone numbers for the European Cup Combined Events 2nd League Monzón 2006.

6. ACCREDITATION

6.1 General

Each team member will receive an accreditation card, which must be worn at all times and should be clearly visible. Security personnel will control all areas. The accreditation is not transferable and does not allow the holder to take another person beyond checkpoints. Photos are not required for the accreditation card system.

6.2 Accreditation Procedure

Accreditation cards will be prepared in advance of the event, based on the information provided by the Member Federation on the final entry forms. No changes will be accepted after the final entry deadline.

Accreditation cards will be distributed at the information desk upon arrival.

6.3 Loss of an Accreditation Card

Any lost or damaged accreditation cards should be reported to the Information desk in the Team hotel. Duplicate cards can be obtained where proof of identity can be established.

6.4 Access Areas for Teams

All team accreditation cards will allow access to the team seating area, warm up area, changing facilities and physiotherapy rooms. Only athletes who are about to compete will have access to the call room and to the infield.

The Head of Delegation from each team is invited to the VIP Hospitality area and will be given the necessary access on the accreditation card.

Separate cards will be issued to Team Leaders, for access to the TIC and Doping Control areas.

7. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

7.1 Technical Information Centre (TIC)

The main function of the centre is to ensure smooth communication between each Team Delegation, the LOC and EAA Technical Delegates and the Competition Administration, regarding technical matters.

The TIC is located at the Stadium (see stadium plan).

The TIC will be open at the following times:

1 st July	10.00 till 21.00
2 nd July	10.00 till 21.00

Before the start of the competition, the teams will receive all the technical information through the Information desk at the hotel.

The TIC will be linked to all information desks set up for this event and shall be responsible for the following:

- Competition information
- Notification of lists of competitors (start lists)
- Liaison points concerning technical matters between Team Delegate, Technical Delegate and LOC
- Settlement of technical enquiries from delegations
- Record forms
- Recovery of confiscated items at the call room
- Applications for 'national records' doping control and photo finish prints
- Urgent notices – collection and delivery of any urgent written notices to the Team Delegations from Technical Delegates, EAA and LOC
- Receipt of protests from the teams
- Publication of results. Results will be displayed on the notice boards near the TIC
- Official invitations
- All technical information regarding the competition will be distributed to each delegation in a special mailbox given to each team. This information will also be displayed on information boards. Information put in the mailboxes will include daily programme, start lists, results as well as official information from EAA and LOC.

Access to the TIC will be controlled by a separate entry card, not by the accreditation card. TIC cards will be given to each team leader.

Teams that were not able to attend the Technical Meeting, under extreme circumstances, can collect their competition numbers from the TIC or the hotel Information desk after the technical meeting.

7.2 Technical Meeting

The Technical Meeting will be held on 30th June at 19.00, in the Hotel Vianetto (Team's hotel)

Each team may be represented by a maximum of two people and, if necessary, an interpreter. It is very important that all teams are represented at the Technical Meeting.

All questions related to the Technical Meeting must be presented in writing, preferably in English, to the Information desk in the hotel before 14.00 on 30th June. The Technical Meeting will be conducted in English.

7.3 Equipment

The implements provided by the LOC are selected from those appearing on the current IAAF approved equipment list. See appendix 2.

Federations requiring IAAF approved equipment not listed by the LOC may present such equipment prior to the competition to the Information desk at the Team hotel for inclusion in the competition pool, subject to test. Equipment must be presented prior to the technical meeting (30th June at 19.00) and will be returned only after the completion of each day's events at the TIC in the Stadium.

All personal implements are to be used during the event by other athletes.

Basic implements will be provided for warm up and training.

7.4 Inspection of Competition Venue

Teams may visit the Track of the Municipality Sports Complex, inspecting access routes and other facilities which will be important to the teams on 29th June or 30th June during the training sessions.

There will be no organised tour as the presentation regarding the competition and warm up areas will be given at the Technical Meeting.

7.5 Competition Area

Track of the Municipality Sports Complex and its surroundings are shown in appendix 3 of this document. There are 3000 of seats in the stadium.

The stadium has the following competition sites:

- 8 lanes
- 2 High Jump site
- 2 Pole Vault site
- 2 site for Long/Triple Jump
- 2 Shot Put Circle
- 1 Combined Discus/Hammer Circle
- 2 Javelin sites

The surface has been renovated by Mondo one month ago.

The maximum spike lengths in the various events are:

- Track, Long Jump, Triple Jump and Pole Vault: 9mm
- High Jump and Javelin: 12mm

7.6 Dressing / Physiotherapy Rooms

Dressing rooms with showers are located just below the main stand. In addition, physiotherapy tables and ice machines are available at the Teams rest area

7.7 Training

Athletes will have the possibility to train in the Track of the Municipality Sports Complex.

Opening hours of this facility will be: 29th June from 18.30 to 20.15 and 30th June from 10.30 to 12.45 and from 18.30 to 20.15.

Equipment and implements necessary for training will be available at the training venue. LOC staff will be present to help in the case of problems or special requirements. Drinks will be available at the training venue. Accreditation must be handed in when borrowing equipment, and will be returned to the athlete when the equipment is handed back in.

The Weight training room will be available at the same time as training sessions.

Details about transportation for training sessions are included in the transport section of this manual. The transport schedule will be displayed at the information desk in the hotel.

7.7.1 Training with Official Starters

This will take place at Track of the Municipality Sports Complex from 17.30 to 18.15 on 30th June.

8. COMPETITION REGULATIONS

8.1 Team Composition

Each EAA Member may enter 1 (one) men's team and 1 (one) women's team. In the Second League each country may enter up to 4 (four) male athletes (in Decathlon) and/or up to 4 (four) female athletes (in Heptathlon).

8.2 Final Entries

Final entries shall be made through the EAA online entry system. The online entry system will be accessible on the EAA website: www.european-athletics.org in the section "Competition". Member federations should use the already known ID and password.

Final entries indicating the names of the athletes and their performances in the current year, plus the names of officials must be submitted not later than 10 (ten) days before the competition i.e. by **midnight on 21 June 2006**.

8.3 Final Confirmation

Team Leaders or their representatives must confirm the names of those competitors already entered who will actually take part in the competition.

Forms for the final declaration and confirmation will be distributed to each delegation during accreditation. The forms must be completed and returned immediately. Final start lists will be ready for collection at the Information desk at the hotel one hour after the Technical Meeting.

8.3.1 Withdrawal

Withdrawal of any confirmation must be indicated to the TIC in writing on the official withdrawal form.

After the Technical Meeting justified changes due to injury, illness or other uncontrollable matters will be possible until the beginning of the respective event, provided that the Technical Delegate has been previously informed and has accepted the change.

8.4 Competition Numbers

The LOC will provide the teams with competition numbers at the Technical Meeting.

Each competitor receives 2 numbers. Their personal competition number shall be pinned on the front and the back of the competition clothing. The competition numbers may not be cut, bent or covered in any way.

8.5. Participation Order/Lanes

The athletes' participation order or lane assignment for each event is according to drawing done by the EAA Technical Delegate, Mr. Roberto Guidi (ITA).

Further details will be given to teams upon arrival.

8.6 Scoring

The total sum of points obtained by the best 3 (three) athletes from each team will be used to establish the final order of the teams. Any team which has got less than 3 (three) athletes to score individually shall not figure in the final order of the teams.

In case of a tie in the overall total of points, the teams concerned will be placed according to the total of the individual placing achieved by their 3 (three) best athletes in a specific ranking excluding the fourth athlete of each team and athletes scoring individually. If the tie still exists, the team having the athlete with the highest total of points in the individual order shall be placed before the other team(s).

8.7 Competition Clothing

Competitors must wear the Federation's official team clothing. IAAF Rule 143 will be strictly applied. Please make sure to follow the IAAF Advertising Regulations (version 08/2005). Clothing and items not conforming to this rule and the current IAAF Advertising Regulations will be removed or taped at the call room.

The EAA has a record of the Team vests of all Member Federations on the EAA website. If the uniform displayed on the website differs from your current official uniform, a full set of photographs must be provided to the EAA (preferably in an electronic version):

- JPEG file, maximum resolution and size 300 dpi / 500KB
- Compressed ZIP file, if possible
- Mail to: competition@european-athletics.org
- Otherwise, the existing records will be used as reference

Team clothing must be uniform. A competitor wearing any other clothing will have no access to the competition area and will not be allowed to compete.

This rule applies both to competition clothing (vest, shorts and tights) as well as to tracksuits.

The maximum length of spikes is for track events, long jump, triple jump and pole vault 9mm and for high jump and javelin 12mm

9. COMPETITION PROCEDURE

9.1 Timetable

Please refer to Appendix 1 for the competition timetable

9.2 Personal Implements/Poles

See point 7.3

9.3 Warm-up Area

The Warm-up Area consists of a large area of grass, and it is located close to the back straight. There is also a weight lifting room just behind the main stand.

Massage facilities, changing rooms and a rest area are also available.

9.4 Call Room

The following checks will be carried out on equipment that must comply with IAAF Advertising and Competition Rules:

- Competition clothing
- Shoes
- Bags
- That non-authorized equipment (radio, Walkman, mobile phone, camera etc) are not brought infield.

9.5 Competition preparation

9.5.1 Field Events

In the field events the official trials supervised by the judges. Athletes may only use the official markers for the approach. These will be hand out by the competition officials at the competition area.

9.5.2 Start commands

The starter commends will be given in English, as follows:

For distances up to and including 400 m and 4 x 400 m:

- "On your marks
- "Set"
- Fire of the gun

For distances of 800 m and more:

- "On your marks"
- Fire of the gun.

If for any reason the starter feels it is necessary to interrupt the process he/she will say:

- "Stand Up"

A Silent Gun will be used. For recall an ordinary starter's gun will be used. There are false start indicators installed on the starting blocks.

9.6 Timing and measurement

The official timing will be provided by Royal Spanish Athletic Federation and will be displayed on the official electronic timing instrument and photo finish cameras provided by Finish Lynx.

The distance measurements for the following events will be taken by electronic equipment from Pentax-RFEA:

- Long Jump
- Shot Put
- Javelin
- Discus

The High Jump and Pole Vault will be measured manually.

9.7 Exit procedures after the Competition

After the competition, athletes leave immediately the infield through the mixed zone where media interviews will be carried out. The clothing baskets will be brought to the mixed zone.

9.8 Protests and Appeals

Protests are permitted and will be processed in accordance with IAAF Rule 146.

In the first instance, protests must be made orally to the Referee by the athlete himself/herself or by a responsible official acting on his/her behalf (Rule 146.3). Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event (posted on the TIC information board).

Any written appeal to the Jury of Appeal must be signed by a responsible official on behalf of the athlete and submitted to TIC within 30 minutes after the official announcement of the decision made by the Referee.

When submitting an appeal form, a deposit of EUR 100, as set in the rules, must be paid. If the protest is unsuccessful, the deposit will not be returned. The Jury's decision will be provided in writing at the TIC.

9.9 Interviews

Immediately after the competition, athletes may be asked to attend the media present at the Stadium.

9.10 Doping Control

Doping Control Programme is conducted under the IAAF Procedural Guidelines for Doping Control, and is supervised by the EAA Doping Control Delegate.

Athletes and team leaders should carry an official picture identification card together with the accreditation card during the event.

During the competition competitors are strongly encouraged to initially check the status of medication with their own team physicians.

The athlete must sign the form and make his/her way to the Doping Control Centre by the given time.

The doping control will be carried out, in accordance with the IAAF regulations, in the Doping Control Centre. All Athletes who have to undergo doping control will be escorted by LOC staff to the control room.

They will be provided with an official accreditation card for a team official, who may be invited to accompany the athlete to the Doping Control Centre. This accreditation card must be given back at the Doping Control Centre immediately after arrival.

The samples will be taken by the accredited personnel and supervised by the EAA Doping Delegate. The samples will be tested at an IOC-accredited laboratory.

9.10.1 Additional Testing

Athletes requiring tests for national records or other purposes and who have not been otherwise selected may request these tests at the TIC, by completing the Doping Control Request Form. The cost for these tests will be paid by the EAA and will be deducted from the member federation's subvention from the EAA, after the European Cup Combined Events.

10. Medical Services

10.1 General

The medical service is in charge of any medical assistance to the team leaders, the competition organization, the information personnel, the honorary guests as well as, during the competition, to the spectators in the stadium.

The participating teams are responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover illness or injury to any member of their team when travelling to and from EAA competitions and during the event it self (EAA Regulation 607.14).

In case of an emergency please contact the nearest medical aid station, in other cases the given instructions should be followed. Below is information on the medical care sites and relevant instructions.

10.2 Medical Services in the Hotel

See point 5.7

10.3 Medical Care at the stadium

The stadium medical service is responsible for any problems concerning the athletes' health. There is also a room for medical attention next to the finish line. The team doctor has access to the medical service facilities when an athlete of his/her own team is hurt or is in need of other medical attention. There are also well equipped physiotherapy facilities here. The stadium medical service is also responsible for first aid in the warming up area.

There are two of first aid teams on the infield, supervised by a doctor and marked with red crosses.

11. SECURITY

Instructions given by the LOC, the security personnel and the police have to be followed in all areas, as well as during transport from location to another.

The accreditation card must be worn at all times. If an accreditation is lost, this should be reported immediately to any LOC Information Desk.

12. CEREMONIES

12.1. Victory Ceremonies

The victory ceremonies for the winning teams Men and Women will take place at the competition venue. Athletes must wear the official team clothing for the ceremonies.

12.2. Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony will take place on Saturday, 1st July at 11.30 at Track of the Municipality Sports Complex.

12.3. Closing Ceremony

A short Closing Ceremony will be organised after the Teams Victory Ceremonies. More information will be given to the teams at the Technical Meeting.

12.4. Closing Banquet

The Closing Banquet will take place on Sunday, 2nd July at 21.45 at the Restaurant Piscis at Monzón. The restaurant is located 200m far from the team's hotel. Everyone with accreditation or an invitation is welcome to attend.

During the closing banquet the LOC will give some trophies to the individual winners in the overall classification and the individual winner in each event of the decathlon or heptathlon.

13. DEPARTURE

Teams will be asked to provide full travel details on the on-line entry system. Teams will also receive a departure form, which should be completed and returned to the LOC Information Desk in the hotel, at least 24 hours before departure, especially if there are any changes to the preliminary confirmed details.

Departure times of the shuttle buses from the hotel will be provided and displayed at the LOC Information Desk.

All outstanding fees, charges and possible other expenses must be settled with the cashier. On the day of departure the LOC Hotel Manager checks the rooms together with the team leaders.
